This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'C' standard or above in English to 75% in all year levels.
- Increase the percentage of Year 5 students achieving NAPLAN National Minimum Standard (NMS) in Reading to 85%.
- Increase the percentage of Year 5 students in NAPLAN Upper 2 Bands (U2B) in Reading to 25% or above.
- Close the Indigenous/Non-Indigenous gap in the NAPLAN Reading Mean Scale Score (MSS) in Year 5 by 50% from 41 to 20.
- Close the Indigenous/Non-Indigenous gap in the NAPLAN Reading Mean Scale Score (MSS) in Year 3 from 5 to 0.

- Building a consistent approach to using student goals (in Reading) to support student learning.
- Deepening teachers' capability in best practice high-yield differentiation practices (in Reading) to meet the needs of all students in classes, including high achieving students and students with disability.
